




Areas of growth include. Reading proficiency was stagnant with 13.6% in 2016 and 3.3.4% in 2017. The 2017. Title grade science proficiency decreased from 32.7% in 2016 to 30% in 2017. The reading growth for the LPS decreased from 63.5% to 46.9%.

Although every effort was made to maintain a focused leadership agenda, the lack of quality certified teachers in fourth and lifth grades hindered our improvement efforts.

To further analyze our strengths and areas of growth. Dr. Otha Beicher, Area I. Assistant Superintendent (DLT) conducted MAAP 2017 data meetings with teachers in

August/September 2017. During these meetings, we realized that our scholars underperformed on the heavily weighted standards, and performed average or above average on the standards that do not carry much weight on the MAAP. Dr. Belcher implemented a scope and sequence




